

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT INSTITUTE - NATIONAL EMERGENCY TRAINING CENTER

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Emergency Management Institute (EMI) provides training to enhance U.S. emergency management practices through a nationwide program of resident and non-resident instruction. Approximately 4,000 students attend resident courses each year, while 100,000 individuals participate in non-resident programs sponsored by EMI and conducted by state emergency management agencies. Additionally, tens of thousands of individuals use EMI distance learning programs such as independent study courses and the Emergency Education Network in home communities. Institute courses conducted by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) include the FEMA Higher Education Project and FEMA Independent Study courses.

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS

Representatives of government at all levels, members of volunteer organizations and interested individuals.

TYPE OF ASSISTANCE

Stipends may be available to cover all or part of the training/housing costs.

AVAILABLE FUNDING

SOURCE OF FUNDS

Department of Homeland Security – Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

APPLICATION PROCESS/DEADLINES

For detailed information about the institute and a schedule of program offerings, refer to the current EMI Catalog of Activities; under the standard enrollment process for resident EMI courses, applications should be coordinated with the applicant's local county emergency program manager and must be reviewed and approved by:

- The state training officer,
- The FEMA regional training manager, and
- The Admissions Office of the National Emergency Training Center.

Note: If a 75-5 form is mailed directly to the Emergency Management Institute, they will return it to the applicant for proper processing.
