

JUVENILE JUSTICE DELINQUENCY PREVENTION GRANTS – FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF JUVENILE JUSTICE

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The focus of all programs funded through Juvenile Justice Delinquency Prevention Grants is the prevention and reduction of juvenile delinquency through targeted prevention efforts. These efforts focus on identified high-referral communities. An example of an eligible project is an after-school program for high-risk youth.

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS

Community-based not-for-profit organizations, nonprofit divisions of local government, local law enforcement agencies, faith-based organizations and nonprofit companies.

TYPE OF ASSISTANCE

Grants.

AVAILABLE FUNDING

Up to \$100,000 per grant award; approximately \$6 million is available on an annual basis.

SOURCE OF FUNDS

Motor Vehicle Theft Prevention Trust Fund, "Invest in Children" license plate revenue, Community Partnership Trust Funds and federal Juvenile Accountability Block Grant Funds.

APPLICATION PROCESS/DEADLINES

Requests for proposals are usually released in early January and posted on the Internet. The application deadline is early March; the funding cycle is July 1 through June 30.

MATCHING/OTHER REQUIREMENTS

A 20-percent match is required for the first year and increases if the grant is renewed; the match may be cash or in-kind.
