

JUVENILE JUSTICE AND DELINQUENCY PREVENTION PROGRAM – FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF JUVENILE JUSTICE

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Administered by Florida Department of Juvenile Justice, the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Program provides grants to community-based providers to develop creative and innovative delinquency prevention and diversion programs.

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS

Public or private not-for-profit agencies, units of general purpose local government or a combination of general purpose local governments. The organization also funds for-profit companies and organizations.

TYPE OF ASSISTANCE

Grants.

AVAILABLE FUNDING

Grants will come under the Title II and Title V funding streams; specific funding amounts are unknown at this time. The organization currently has three federal funding streams Title II, Title V and JABG (Juvenile Accountability Block Grants).

SOURCE OF FUNDS

U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention.

MATCHING/OTHER REQUIREMENTS

Fifty-percent match is required of local governments on Title V funding. Proof of denial of local funding is required for private local agencies. All Title II applicants must submit a denial of local funding. There is no match for JABG funding.
