Amber Hughes Update

- <u>SB 7068</u> and <u>HB 7061</u> Tax Package Neutral Both bills are on Special Order in the Senate today, April 26.
- SJR 1182 (Brandes), HJR 1377 (Chaney), SB 1186 (Brandes) and HB 1379 (Chaney) Property Tax
 Bills Neutral All four bills are on Special Order in the Senate today, April 26.
- HB 1239 (Tomkow) Broadband Internet Infrastructure/Municipal Electric Utilities Neutral –
 HB 1239 is on Third Reading in the House today, April 26.

David Cruz Update

- Update: <u>HB 403</u> (Giallombardo) **Home-based Businesses** Oppose HB 403 passed the House last week and is now on the Senate side. It is *not* on today's Senate calendar. The League opposes HB 403 and is neutral on the Senate bill, SB 266 (Perry). <u>Please contact your senator</u> and ask them to vote NO on HB 403.
- HB 337 (DiCeglie) Impact Fees Oppose HB 337 is on Third Reading in the Senate today, April 26. Contact your senator and ask them to vote NO on HB 337. If the bill passes today, it will be sent to the governor.
- SB 1876 (Albritton) and HB 421 (Tuck, Persons-Mulicka) Relief from Burdens on Real Property Rights/Bert Harris Act Oppose HB 421 has passed the full House. HB 421 and SB 1876 are on Special Order in the Senate today, April 26.

Rebecca O'Hara Update

- HB 839 (Fabricio) Express Preemption of Fuel Retailers and Related Transportation
 Infrastructure Oppose HB 839 is on Third Reading in the Senate today, April 26.
- HB 919 (Tomkow) Preemption on Restriction Utility Services Oppose HB 919 is on Third Reading in the Senate today, April 26.
- <u>SB 1890</u> (Rodrigues) **Campaign Financing Oppose** SB 1890 is on Third Reading in the House today, April 26.
- House and Senate are reaching an agreement on the state budget. \$500 million for septic to sewer conversions is currently included in the budget.

Tara Taggart Update

- <u>HB 401</u> (Fetterhoff) **Florida Building Code Neutral on building design compromise language** that contains exemptions HB 401 is on Third Reading in the Senate today, April 26. If the bill passes the Senate today, it will bounce back over to the House.
- <u>HB 55</u> (Overdorf) **Building Design Oppose** HB 55 is on Third Reading in the House today, April 26.

Scott Dudley Update

Update: <u>SB 2006</u> (Burgess) and <u>HB 7047</u> (Leek) Emergency Management – Oppose – SB 2006 passed the Senate last week and will now be sent over to the House.
