Dear Representative Busatta:

On behalf of the Florida League of Cities, I respectfully request that you extend the effective date of section 2 of CS/HB 1451. Section 2 eliminates current law authority for a municipal utility to impose a surcharge for servicing extraterritorial customers. The current effective date is July 1, 2027. We request an extension of this date to 2029 for the following reasons:

- It will allow time for utilities to procure a firm to conduct a rate study to develop new rates for extraterritorial customers to ensure municipal customers do not subsidize extraterritorial service. Rate studies typically take 6-9 months to complete.
- It will provide time for the utility's governing body to adopt the new rate at a public hearing and to hold the additional public meeting within the extraterritorial area, as required by the bill.
- Extension of the effective date will give time for the utility to modify existing interlocal agreements that were predicated on existing surcharges, as well as hold the additional public meetings to ratify the agreements, as required by the bill.
- Extension of the effective date may give the utility additional time to refinance any debt service that was based on existing surcharges.
- Extension of the effective date will give the utility time to revise or cancel planned projects that may have been funded by surcharge revenue.
